Project Experience:

2005 - 2006 Whisky (On time, under budget)

Project Whisky is the conversion of the Turners and growers domestic produce sales and procurement system to SAP. Development of automated interfaces to the legacy market systems was required to allow a smooth phased rollout of SAP around the country. I was responsible for design / development of these interfaces. There was almost no documentation of the legacy processes so I worked closely with all members of the project team and key members of the business to ensure that the business had continuity during the project and subsequent rollout.

2004 Coolstore Web interface (On time, under budget)

The Coolstore Web interface was my idea to allow partners to store fruit on ENZA's behalf without having to buy a separate software package. The system was a J2EE web based system that integrated tightly into SAP via the JCo RFC interface. I produced the business case and presented it to the Executive. I produced the design documentation, developed the system, coordinated the infrastructure requirements with the T&G IS operations personnel and managed the external end users testing of the system.

2003 Paris II (On time, under budget)

After the success of PARIS I the business wanted the ENZA inventory all moved to SAP WM. The process and my part were the same as PARIS I except the interfaces were more complex. The interfaces to partner coolstores were changed to utilise new technology. Coordination of technical issues between the partners during the SDLC was my largest responsibility.

2002 Paris (On time, under budget)

The ENZA business needed to replace the Jade & SAP 3.1 warehouse system with SAP 4.7. PARIS I created an inventory system for Non-Enza fruit to prove the concept. My brief was to select design and manage the development of the interfaces to third parties. I worked with Intelligroup to choose the middleware (BC) and design the system. I managed two contractors to complete the development.
